Definition of Terms and Symbols

Lesson at a Glance: A chart at the beginning of each lesson that outlines various activity options for the lesson. Beside each activity is the suggested grade level, the activity focus (doing, seeing, listening, discussion), necessary PITstops, and additional supplies needed. A checkmark is placed by activities to be presented if there is a short amount of class time (25-35 minutes)

ILO: The Intended Learning Outcome (ILO) is the aim or purpose of each lesson. It is found at the bottom of the Lesson at a Glance page.

PITstop: Material to help Put It Together (PIT). Visual aids, skits, and other activities to enhance the lesson are included as PITstops. PITstops are included after the lesson pages.

Dialogue Folder: A writing exercise to be completed by the Junior Soldiers at the end of each lesson. This is designed to facilitate communication between leader and Junior Soldiers. At the end of each class session the leader will collect Dialogue Folders. The leader will make comments on each folder and return the folders to the Junior Soldiers during the next meeting.

MTV: At the end of each lesson there is a section of suggested supplemental Music, Texts and Videos (MTV) to use during the lesson or as reinforcement during the week.

TLC: The lesson Connection (TLC) indicates the application of each lesson to the daily and spiritual lives of Junior Soldiers. It is found at the end of each lesson.

Layout & Special Features

Memory Verse Bookmarks follow the introductory pages of each volume. There is one bookmark for each unit. The four memory verses of the unit are printed on the bookmark. Make a photocopy of the page for each junior soldier. At the end of the unit give junior soldiers the bookmark that corresponds to the unit completed. You may wish to photocopy the bookmarks onto cardstock or mount on heavy paper.

Unit at a Glance provides a quick reference to the four lessons in the unit. The intended Learning Outcome (ILO) for each lesson, Unit Aim, Unit Bible Truth, and Unit Bible Truth Scripture are outlined. The doctrines emphasized during the unit are listed at the bottom of each page.

Leader's Page is found at the beginning of each unit, behind the Unit at a Glance page. Each page has information on how the lessons in the unit connect to The Salvation Army, the students, and the leader. A section on leader development is also included.

Lesson at a Glance contains a chart that outlines various activity options for the lesson. Beside each activity is the suggested grade level, the activity focus, necessary PITstops, and additional supplies needed. A checkmark is placed by activities that should ALWAYS be included. If there is time, additional material will greatly enhance the learning experience.

Size Wise teaching tips are located throughout the volume. Information included in Size Wise tips will help the leader choose or adapt activities for smaller or larger junior soldier brigades.

Teacher Options are in shaded boxes at the end of select activity options. Information listed provides the leader with creative alternatives to the written material.

Timesaving Tips are included to help the leader who is strapped for time. The information provided in Timesaving Tips will help the leader transform “wasted” time into valuable teaching time.

Teacher Tips provide information and helpful hints for a more productive classroom.

Be Aware tips provide information about ways to modify or adapt the lesson for children with special needs.

A PITstop page (Put It Together) is material the leader may incorporate throughout the lesson. A visual cue is located in the teaching material to indicate where the information is inserted. Each PITstop is labeled with a letter. PITstop pages are located behind the teaching material.

Layout & Special Features

A **Worship Program** outline is included with each lesson. The program may be used during the lesson, or as a mid-week worship program.

Let's Do It! (L.D.I) pages are age appropriate activity sheets to be copied for each junior soldier. Junior soldiers can complete them during the class session, or take them home as review sheets. L.D.I. activity sheets are divided into three levels: 1st and 2nd grade, 3rd and 4th grade, and 5th and 6th grade.

iSpeak pages are at the end of each lesson behind the L.D.I. activity pages. Each week at the conclusion of the lesson junior soldiers have an opportunity to share their thoughts, feelings, and questions about the material in the lesson.

KIDSpeak pages include a photo of a junior soldier, a short message from him or her about the information covered in the unit, and a place for junior soldiers to add their thoughts about the unit. A KIDSpeak page appears in the fourth lesson of each unit, replacing the iSpeak (Dialogue Page) for that lesson. KIDSpeak pages become a part of the Dialogue Folder.

HOMEpage is intended for families of junior soldiers. Included in each HOMEpage is a summary of information covered in the lesson, the memory verse, the aim/purpose of the lesson, and a parent point. The parent point is designed to get parents talking to their children about what they are learning in junior soldiers. Send a copy of HOMEpage home with each junior soldier in yourbrigade.

A **What Do You Think?** Evaluation form is provided at the end of each unit. Please make comments on what worked well in your brigade, what needs improvement, and any creative adaptations you made to the lessons. The Christian Education staff at National Headquarters review each evaluation form.

Answer Sheets to L.D.I. activity pages are included in the back of each volume.

Weekly Attendance Page – write in the names of your junior soldiers and make 4 copies, one for each month.

The Junior Soldier Lesson Completion Record – Photocopy this 2- sided form for each junior soldier in your brigade. The form provides a place to record important information about each child, including attendance in, and completion of, the Totally His prep classes, date of enrollment and Honor Junior Soldier Completion date.

PARENT POINT

Ask your child what he or she found most interesting about the lives of William and Catherine Booth.



TODAY IN JUNIOR SOLDIERS the children began a four-week unit on the beginning of The Salvation Army. Today the junior soldiers learned about the founders of The Salvation Army, William and Catherine Booth.

William Booth was born on April 10, 1829, in Nottingham, England. The Booth family was not a religious family. It was not until after his father's death that William Booth attended church. In 1844, at the age of 15, William Booth asked God for salvation, and dedicated his life to serving God. William Booth proclaimed, "God shall have all there is of William Booth!"

William Booth was concerned with the poor and unwanted people of London. He dedicated his ministry to leading others to Christ, especially those who were unwelcome in London's churches.

In 1851, William Booth was ordained in the Methodist church. Edward Rabbits supported William Booth for 3 months so he could devote himself fully to preaching the gospel.

Catherine Mumford was born to Methodist parents on January 17, 1829. Her mother taught her how to read and write at a young age. By the age of 12, Catherine had read the Bible through eight times. In 1844, the Mumford family moved to London, England. After years of Bible reading and Bible study, Catherine Mumford gave her life to God at the age of 17.


In 1851, Edward Rabbits introduced William Booth to Catherine Mumford. In 1852, they were engaged to be married. For the next three years, while William was traveling as a Methodist minister, He and Catherine wrote many letters to each other. In 1855, they were married, and began serving he Lord together.

In 1865, Catherine Booth received an invitation to speak at a church in London, which led William Booth to accept support from a lay-run East London Mission. William Booth's work with the mission in East London was the starting point for his East London Christian Mission, which would later become The Salvation Army.

INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOME

This lesson helped junior soldiers learn about our founders, William and Catherine Booth. By studying the Booths' childhoods, conversions, and early ministry, junior soldiers learned about the foundation for The Salvation Army.

SALVATION ARMY CONNECTION

The first doctrine of The Salvation Army states our belief in the Bible as God's Word.

"We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and that they only constitute the Divine rule of Christian faith and practice."

The Bible is the guidepost of The Salvation Army. The Bible is the foundation of all Salvation Army belief and practice. It is the source from which all Salvation Army doctrine is derived.

Serving God, serving man, and sharing the news of Jesus Christ is commanded in the Bible. Jesus said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength...Love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:30-31) Jesus also said, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19) Service to God and man, and spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ is the purpose of The Salvation Army.

The junior soldiers in your brigade need to know what The Salvation Army believes, and where the basis for the doctrines is found. This unit will help the junior soldiers understand the Bible is the foundation for all Christians, including The Salvation Army.

Bible Beginnings

Junior Soldiers have many tough decisions to make on a daily basis. There are so many things out there to influence them in both positive and negative ways. By teaching this unit on the Bible, you will equip the junior soldiers in your brigade with the most positive influence in their lives, God's Word.

Lesson one introduces junior soldiers to how the Bible became the printed Word of God. Junior soldiers will learn how God's inspired Word went from oral tradition to the printed Bible they reads today.

Lesson two explains the structure of the Bible, the types of books, and the writers. Lessons three and four give a brief overview of God's promise in the Old and New Testaments.

God's Word is a source of comfort, support, and direction. Help your junior soldiers understand that God's Word is relevant to their lives.

DEVOTIONAL

What's in a Name? ?

Before class, look up the meaning of your name in a name book. Also, look up the names of your corps officer, YPSM, and other people the junior soldiers know.

Say: **Do you think it was easy for your parents to pick out your name?** (Allow response.) **There are thousands of names to choose from, and each name has a different meaning. It takes some parents many weeks to pick out a name for their child. Some parents buy books that are full of names and their meanings.** (Show junior soldiers the name book.)

Say: **My name is _____ (insert first name), and it means _____ (insert meaning). Our corps officer's name is _____ (insert name), and it means _____ (insert meaning). The meanings of names are special.**

Mary and Joseph did not have to struggle to pick out a name for Jesus. The angel Gabriel told them what to name the child. (Read Matthew 1:20-23.)

Say: **What does the name Immanuel mean?** (Allow response—"God is with us".)

Say: **Jesus is God's Son. God sent Jesus to live on earth, and to die for our sins. "God is with us" is the perfect name for Jesus, because Jesus is God's Son. God picked out the perfect name for His Son, a name that would let the Hebrews know who Jesus was, the Messiah!**
